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




A teddy bear goes into care



What does 'looked after' mean?

Being 'looked after' means being cared for by someone else, when your own family can't look after you.

What is fostering?

Fostering is when you go to live with another family, called a foster family, who have been trained to look after you. They will help you with all the things that you need to learn as you're growing up.







If I am being bullied, what should I do?

If you think you are being bullied tell someone you trust who can help you, for example, your foster carer, social worker, friend or teacher.

If you are being bullied by your foster carer or someone else who is looking after you, you must tell your social worker or another adult you trust and they will get help.

She tells him, if there's a problem

And she and FCA Scotland will sort it out,
There's no need to run away.

If I want to make a complaint, what should I do?

FCA Scotland has something called a 'complaints procedure' so you can ask questions about what is happening to you and tell us if something does not feel okay. Whateverthe problem is, we will always try and sort it out for you.

You might not be happy about your foster carer(s), social worker, school or something else.

You should talk to your foster carer, social worker or another adult you trust if you are not happy about something and they will try to help you.

If you are still not happy, you can make a complaint.

You should have been given a form with this booklet that you can use to write to the FCA Complaints Manager and tell them what the problem is and ask them to help. Askyour foster carer or someone else you trust to help you fill it in and put it in the post box. If you don't have a complaints form or need a new one, ask your foster carer or someone from FCA Scotland.
